# ASHURST CE AIDED PRIMARY SCHOOL

#### 'SPORTS PREMIUM'

Sports Premium Funding has been an additional funding to all Primary Schools from the academic year 2013-2014 to 2017-2018, and has been extended into 2018-2019.

It is provided jointly by the Departments of Education, Health & Culture and Media & Sport. Its purpose is to improve the quality of sport and PE for all pupils across the school and can only be spent on this provision.

It is for schools to decide how the Sports Premium is spent, as they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the pupils at their school.

From April 2014, schools have been required to publish online information about how they have used, and/or intend to use, their Sports Premium Funding, to ensure that parents and others are made aware of how the additional funding was, and is, being used. From September 2018, schools have also to report of the ability of their end of KS2 pupils in swimming.

Sports Premium funding is received in the financial year, for impact and reporting upon in the academic year.

#### AT ASHURST CE AIDED PRIMARY SCHOOL

- We aim to develop children's knowledge, skills and understanding in PE. Physical well-being is essential to personal and social development and is closely linked to a growing sense of identity, self-image and worth; and to increased confidence.
- We aim to develop and encourage children to plan, participate and evaluate work appropriate to their age and ability. We strive to improve children's physical skills, health and fitness; and encourage them to enjoy PE for its own sake.
- We believe that PE is concerned with developing self-control and a confident, positive attitude necessary in a whole range of different situations including young children learning to dress themselves and/or to hold a pencil correctly. It is also needed in knowing how to handle equipment and apparatus safely.

### Sports Premium Funding 2017-2018

The funding received from Sports Premium Funding was allocated in the following ways:

- To employ qualified PE specialist to enhance and enrich the teaching of all pupils throughout the school, to work with and alongside teachers to increase subject knowledge and confidence in PE
- To employ qualified PE specialists to run extra-curricular clubs, for KS1 and KS2 pupils
- To provide specialist-taught swimming lessons for all pupils Y1-Y6
- To pay for weekly transport to off-site indoor PE/Sports venues and facilities for all pupils Y1-Y6, allowing pupils in YR more space in school.
- To pay for transport to facilitate pupil attendance at Locality and Inter-School sporting events
- To pay towards the upkeep of the local Recreation Ground, as a venue for seasonal school PE/Games and Sports Day for all pupils YR-Y6
- To forge links with local schools to increase collective and individual provision in PE, including 'pooled' funding, as appropriate.

#### THE IMPACT OF SPORTS PREMIUM FUNDING 2017-2018

- An increase in the number of pupils able to access and enjoy a whole range of different sports in school time throughout the academic year such as: hockey and basketball, and of extra- curricular clubs after school such as: Y1/2 seasonal Football, Athletics and Multi-Skills Clubs; and KS2 Football, Rounders and Cricket Clubs.
- An increase in the number of certificates of participation and achievement in a range of different sports awarded to pupils at School Assemblies throughout the year

- An increase in the number of cups, medals and shields awarded to all pupils in range of sports on Sports Day 2018
- An increase in the number of KS1 and KS2 pupils who chose to take part in lunchtime football sessions with the Headteacher during the winter months.
- Participation, success and enjoyment in locality and inter-school sports and competitions such as: Multi-Skills, Athletics, Inter School Rounders, Girls' Swimming Gala, Tag Rugby Tournament, Football Competition and Cricket Days.
- Participation success and enjoyment in PE/Sport at specialist venues such as: Dalesdown (Availability Wednesdays, Autumn half term to Summer half term), Sports Complex Horsham Rugby Club, Henfield Cricket Ground and The Towers' Convent School (Swimming) and Jolesfield Primary (Bikeability).
- An increase in the number of pupils and staff able to access, enjoy and benefit from expert training and coaching from such as: Horsham Leisurelink (all Sports) and The Towers (specialist swimming teachers (from October half term 2017 to June 2018).
- An increase in space and accommodation in school for indoor PE/Dance/Movement for YR pupils to develop and improve their skills when KS1 off-site for PE/Sport/Swimming throughout the year.
- An increase in new resources for PE/Sport e.g balls, bats, ropes and hoops
- School attendance figures sustained at, and above, school target of 96% over the whole year, with 10% of pupils enjoying 100% attendance over the year.
- ALL ten Y6 pupils at the end of Y6, able to swim over 25 metres competently, confidently & proficiently using a range of strokes effectively, able to perform safe self-rescue in different water based situations.
