#### • Y5 RESIDENTIAL VISITS TO SWANAGE 2018

All Y5 pupils are set to undertake their week's Residential Visit to Swanage from 24-28<sup>th</sup> September 2018. The school looks forward to organising a final information/itinerary/clothing afternoon/evening for respective parents VERY shortly. Y6 pupils Residential Visit to Swanage is confirmed as June 24<sup>th</sup> -28<sup>th</sup> 2019. Both Visits are with Mrs Pockett and myself, at this stage.

#### HOMEWORK

A paper copy of the school's HOMEWORK POLICY - still in effect from 2016 is to be sent home to ALL FAMILIES at the beginning of this term. There is also a copy on the school's website. #### PE/GAMES/GYMNASTICS/SWIMMING

Weekly PE lessons for pupils in Y3&4 at Dalesdown/the school field, with specialist Horsham Leisurelink PE coach, Mr Denman, begin on Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> September. PE lessons on the school field with Horsham Leisurelink PE coach, Mr Denman, begin on Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> September for Y5&6 pupils. Mr Denman will then stay on at school, and be joined by two more specialist representatives from Horsham Leisurelink, as part of the school's after-school PE/Sport programme throughout the academic year. Starting this Autumn term, school has organised blocked swimming sessions for Infant pupils at The Towers, over lunchtime on Fridays, with specialist coaching, starting on Friday

14<sup>th</sup> September with Y2 pupils. Packed lunches have been arranged with Easylunches. More news of blocked Gymnastics/Dance sessions over 2018-2019 may be found on the Parent/ Carer Noticeboard in the playground AND on the school's website, when organised.

# Registration

In the event of pupils arriving at school after 8.55am registration and/or needing to be collected from school before 3:30pm, parents must register at Office via School House first.

#### Medication

ALL medication for children, and instructions for its use, must be given by parents to the School Office for recording and appropriate storage. This includes inhalers for asthma suffers.

# Injuries

Children who suffer 'minor' head injuries during the school day receive written notification from the school on the day for

their parents' information. The parents of infant pupils are also informed by respective classteachers at the end of the day

## Very Bad Weather Conditions

In the event of very wet and/or very windy weather, all children come and go through the **JUNIOR ENTRANCE** at the start and end of the school day.
