'PUPIL PREMIUM' PROPOSAL STATEMENT
From September 2021



The government 'Pupil Premium' funding to schools is allocated to children who are known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM), Service Children and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. This will also include pupils eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years (known as the Ever 6 FSM measure).

It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium is spent, as they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual children at their school.

From September 2012, schools have been required to publish online information about how they have used the Premium. This is intended to ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of children covered by the Premium and the extra support that they have received.

Pupil Premium funding is received in the financial year, for impact and reporting upon in the academic year.

At Ashurst CE Aided Primary School

- We endeavour to ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all pupils
- We endeavour to ensure that appropriate provision is made for all children, especially those deemed to belong to vulnerable groups.
- In making provision, we recognise that not all children who receive free school meals are socially disadvantaged
- We recognise that not all children who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals.
- We reserve the right to allocate Pupil Premium funding to support any child or groups of children the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged.
- Pupil Premium funding is allocated following an analysis of needs which identifies priority classes, groups and/or individuals.

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NATURE OF SUPPORT 2021-2022

The funding received from Pupil Premium is being allocated in the following ways:

- PPG children who are underachieving will be supported through appropriate interventions.
- To support PPG children with personal, social and emotional development and wellbeing through having access to the National and wider curriculum, including part-funding for trips and resources.
- The allocation of specific resources to enable children to access the curriculum.
- Parents/Carers are engaged with all aspects of school life and events; strong home partnerships are developed.
- Children are able to attend school regularly and on time.
- 1:1 / small group work with children to support their additional needs in the curriculum specifically English and mathematics.
- To purchase additional learning resources principally to support children in the acquisition of literacy and numeracy skills, as appropriate.
- The in-school attainment gap between PP and non-disadvantaged children is reduced in all subjects.
- To increase the opportunities for targeted extended school activities.

THE IMPACT OF PUPIL PREMIUM SPENDING 2020-2021

(Reported upon at Full Governing Body Meeting July 2021)

At the end of the academic year, the school, in consultation with the FGB, reviewed the impact of the measures listed above (bearing in mind the small number of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium and their right to individual confidentiality), and concluded that, as far as was reasonably possible, they represented best value for money and played a direct role in improving the achievement of individual pupils and groups of pupils.



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
